Consumer prices have jumped almost 4% in the past year.

Households are feeling the pinch of higher prices at the grocery store, the gas stations, and even booking travel. Over the past year, the measure for PCE - personal consumption expenditures - has shot up 3.9%, reflecting the biggest gain since 2008 when oil prices hit a record high of \$150 a barrel. A separate measure, Core PCE inflation that strips out food and energy also climbed to 3.4%, the highest level since 1992.

As the U.S is experiencing rising prices, most economists say the increase in inflation is likely temporary. **The Fed still predicts PCE inflation will drop back to 2.1% by 2022.**

While much of the strength in inflation recently should prove temporary, Citibank expressed to clients that they expect Core PCE inflation to run above the 2% target through 2022.

For now, stocks are still rising and yields on long-dated U.S. Treasuries have declined in recent months.

Some economists worry that prices will not drop back to 2% in 2022 as the Fed expects.

The central bank itself has underestimated the increase in inflation. The Fed now expects PCE inflation to average 3.4% in 2021, up from a 1.8% forecast at the end of last year.

Cleaning Combo: Vinegar and Dawn Dish Detergent



This dynamic combination is incredibly effective in a wide range of household uses.

Shower Cleaner

Use Dawn dish detergent and plain white vinegar at a 1 to 1 ratio.

This cleaner can be diluted by half with water to scrub lawn furniture and other outdoor items.

Weed Killer

Half gallon warm vinegar
Half gallon warm water
2 cups of salt
Half cup of dawn

The warmed water and vinegar dissolve the salt and soap more easily. Combine all ingredients and mix well. Transfer to a spray bottle and spritz on anything in the garden you wish to kill.

Oven Cleaner

Sprinkle baking soda on the bottom of your oven and spritz it with a 50/50 mixture of vinegar and dawn. Wait 6-8 hours and then wipe it up.

Bourbon Peach-Glazed Baby Back Ribs

No BBQ? No Problem! Try this oven ready recipe.

Ingredients:

1 tsp smoked paprika
1 tsp onion powder
1 tsp garlic powder
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
1 tbsp chili powder
2 tbsp light brown sugar
2 racks baby back ribs
3 tbsp apple cider vinegar
3 tbsp bourbon
½ cup peach preserves

Preparation:

Combine smoked paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, ½ tsp salt, ½ tsp pepper, chili powder and brown sugar.

Place each rack of ribs on a piece of aluminum foil large enough to seal the rack, set on a baking sheet. Sprinkle the dry rub on both sides of the ribs. Leave uncovered, meat-side up; refrigerate at least 1 hour up to overnight.

Preheat oven to 300 degrees Fahrenheit.

Whisk vinegar, bourbon, preserves, 2 tbsp water, and large pinch of salt and pepper. Pour half of the mixture over each rack. Tightly seal each in the foil, crimping the edges to make a packet.

Transfer to oven and bake until meat is tender and starts to pull away from the bones, about 1 ½ hours.

Remove from oven, open foil packets and pour liquid into a small saucepan. Simmer over medium-high heat stirring frequently, 6 to 8 minutes until reduced by about half to a thin, syrupy glaze. It will thicken further as it cools.

Line another baking sheet with foil and gently transfer both racks of ribs to it. Position a rack on the top level of the oven and preheat the broiler.

Using a pastry brush, coat ribs with about half of the glaze. Broil until browned and charred in spots, 2-4 minutes. Brush on more glaze and return to the broiler 2-4 more minutes. Brush finished ribs with remaining glaze. Slice between bones and serve.

When getting dental work done in Mexico, it's also important to factor in travel costs. Most of the time, your lodging costs and food costs will be low once you arrive, and tickets from almost anywhere in the US to Tijuana are very affordable. Crossing the border in a car is also an option. ²

Whatever the plan is, try to balance affordability with comfort, and inform your clinic of your travel itinerary.

It Happened In



July 6, 1885 – The French microbiologist, Louis Pasteur, administers the first successful anti-rabies vaccine to a 9-year-old boy, Joseph Meister. The boy required the vaccine because he had been bitten by a rabid dog.

July 19, 1799 – The Rosetta Stone is discovered by a French soldier stationed in Egypt. The black stone was found in the town of Rosetta about 35 miles from Alexandria.

July 20, 1969 – Neil Armstrong takes the first human step on the moon during Apollo 11's lunar landing mission launched on July 16th of the same year. The event is televised and watched by nearly 530 million people.

July 27, 1953 – The Korean War ended with the signing of an armistice by U.S. and North Korean delegates at Panmunjom, Korea. The war had lasted just over three years.
